Kenneth Ray Morgan, 87, formerly of Wann, OK passed away on January 22, 2021, after a short illness.

There are no services planned at this time due to the pandemic. The family will have a private service at a later date. Internment for both Kenny and Emma will be at the Ball Cemetery in Childers.

Kenny was born September 11, 1933, to Cecil B and Ada (Clifford) Morgan in Dewey, Oklahoma. He received his education at Childers School. He married Emma Jean Breshears on June 20, 1952. They made their home in Childers, OK. While they lived in Childers, they had two daughters, Linda and Peggy Morgan. In 1962, they moved to the family farm in Wann, OK, where they resided for the next 47 years.

Kenny was employed by Phillips Petroleum for 30 years. After a short stint of retirement, he worked for Superior Manufacturing in Dewey, OK. After retirement he enjoyed tinkering in the garage and helping his friends. In December 2009, they moved to their current residence in Bartlesville, OK.

He was a master mechanic; he fixed every lawn mower and weed eater in the neighborhood. Kenny enjoyed fishing, working on the farm, and fixing anything that had wheels. During their retirement years Ken and Emma played cards every morning, most days Emma swore he cheated.

Kenny was preceded in death by the one and only love of his life of 67 years, Emma. His parents, Cecil B and Ada, three brothers – Dick, Jack and Clifford, three sister – Betty, Lila, Cecilia, one infant granddaughter, and an infant great grandson.
