



## Adrian Dennis Osborne

September 8, 1923 - June 24, 2016

August 1945.

After the war he was sent to Japan in the occupation force. He said no one knew what to expect but when they landed the local people were terrified but very helpful. His stay in Japan was short but did visit Hiroshima and said he had seen destruction but nothing like Hiroshima but the atomic bomb did end the war and save a lot of American and Japanese lives.

He returned to the United States and was discharged January 13, 1946 at Fort Bliss, Texas. He had been corresponding with Eileen McCorkle in Bartlesville and they were married on February 14, 1946. He attended Bethany Nazarene College before moving to Bartlesville where he worked for the Prudential Insurance Company in Bartlesville. He later became a realtor and was in the clothing business where he retired at the age of 62.

He was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Eileen, in 2011. He was also preceded in death by his mother, father, two brothers, and one sister. He is survived by their daughter, Jan Selsor and her husband, Bill, a brother, Jerry Osborne, several nieces and nephews and great nieces and nephews, three step-grandchildren, and three step-great grandchildren.
