Mr. Alonzo M. "Al" Call, 72, of Bartlesville, died at 10:50 P.M. Sunday at his home following an illness of several months.

Graveside funeral services for Mr. Call will be held at 10 A.M. Thursday, August 30, 2012 at the Memorial Park Cemetery with Pastor Mark Turner officiating and full military rites accorded by the James H. Teel American Legion Post # 105. Memorial services will follow at 11 A.M. on Thursday at Life Church of Bartlesville also officiated by Pastor Turner. Memorial services and interment will be directed by the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory.

The Call family will receive guests for visitation at the Stumpff Funeral Home on Wednesday evening from 6 P.M. until 8 P.M.

Mr. Call was born in Baxter Springs, Kansas on April 19, 1940 the son of Marcus D. Call and Lois (maiden name) Call. He grew up and received his

education in Independence, Kansas and Ellsworth, Maine. He entered the United States Navy on July 30, 1958 and served until July 11, 1962. Following his Honorable Discharge he came to Bartlesville and was employed with Phillips Petroleum Company for 10 years. Mr. Call then became active as a homebuilder in the Bartlesville area until his retirement. He was married to Jane Gelwick in March of 1963 in Bartlesville and they made their home in Bartlesville. He was later married to Karen Hobbs in Las Vegas, Nevada in June of 2001 and they also made their home in Bartlesville. Mr. Call loved spending time with his family and his dogs. He also enjoyed woodworking, yard work, gardening and fishing. He was a member of Life Church of Bartlesville and has been a volunteer with Meals on Wheels.

Mr. Call is survived by one daughter, Brenna Aston and her husband, Gary of Bartlesville, four grandchildren, Stefan Hollis and wife Kristin, Nathan Hollis, Shara Schlitzberger and Dale Aston, three great grandchildren, Graham Hollis, Kylee Crites and Kenzie Crites, and his former spouses, Jane Call of Bartlesville and Karen Hobbs of Bartlesville. He was preceded in death by his parents and a son-in-law, Bill Broomfield.
