Barbara was very talented, and she was a life long learner. She taught herself how to paint by watching Bob Ross on TV. She took many classes and learned how to make wedding cakes, floral arrangements, ceramics, any type of craft, stained glass and made many stained glass crosses.

Barbara loved to make things beautiful and she turned her passions into occupations.

Barbara once worked as a beautician after putting herself through Beauty College and another time she was employed as a florist in a Flower-shop. Barbara loved country music. She loved to sing, dance and listen to Elvis, Dolly Parton and her very favorite Conway Twitty. She spent many moments making memories with her girls while they were growing up and even to the end of her life by singing with them to all of her favorite songs.

Barbara's Faith was very important to her. She spoke often about her faith and taught her children how to pray. 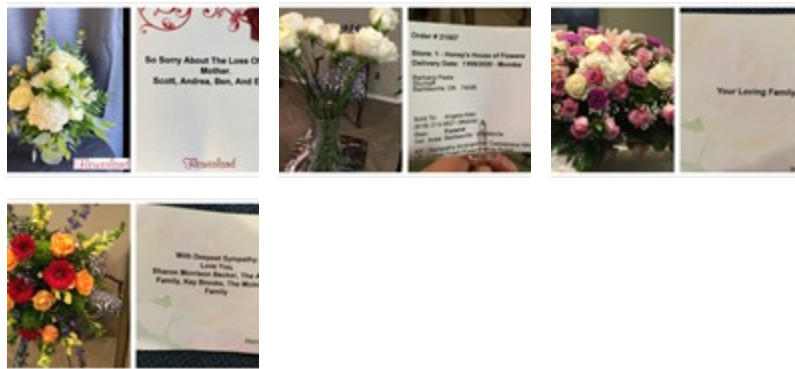
