Billy Dean Booth, 94, was born April 6th 1930 in Guymon, OK. to Mother, Ethel Faye Graves and Father, Lloyd Webster Booth. Bill attended Hardesty High School thru his Senior year. Bill continued to work on the family farm with his Father. Bill married Peggy Earlene Loe on July 14th 1954 in Guymon, OK. Bill and Peggy moved to Borger TX in 1955 where Bill worked for Phillips 66 Petroleum Company from 1955 to 1958. During their time in Borger they had their 1st son, Curtis Alan in 1957. Bill then sold insurance from 1958 to 1962. Bill moved his family to Bartlesville OK in 1962 shortly after the birth of their 2nd son, Lance Wayne. He returned to work at Phillips 66 Petroleum Company as a Power Plant Operator. Bill retired from Phillips 66 in 1992 after 34 years of service.

Bill loved to play the guitar and bass guitar at New Life Pentecostal Holiness Church where he would sing solos in his low bass voice and duets with wife, Peggy. Bill was a Christian and loved the Lord. He raised his sons and his granddaughters in Church. Bill loved to fish, camp, ride motorcycles, and tinker with electronics. Bill loved to shop at 2nd hand stores and garage sales and his house was a testament to that. Bill bought his first female Boston Terrier in 1959 and named her Lady. When one Lady passed away he would buy another female Boston Terrier and name her Lady as well. Bill was on his 7th Lady. Bill and Peggy celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary this past July.

Bill entered Heaven on Saturday September 14th, 2024. He is preceded in death by his parents, Bothers Charles and Estelle Booth, and 6 Boston Terriers, all named Lady.
