He was married to Deryl Crook on June 6, 1969 at Arlington, Texas. After his discharge from the Army they made the home in the Copan and Dewey area where he was self employed as a rancher. He was active in his younger years in calf roping, and team roping. He was dedicated to his family, and in particular loved spending time with his grandchildren.
