She actually did mentoring for her future husband in a special education summer camp many years before they became reacquainted and married. Their common interest in special education was a part of the success in their happy marriage.

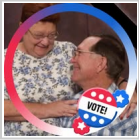

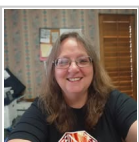
