



## Clayton Edward Booher

June 25, 1962 - January 17, 2019

Clay Booher, 56, passed away at 8:57 a.m. on January 17, 2019, with his family by his side.

Clay was born on June 25, 1962, to Natalie and Gary Bond. He was raised in the Arkansas area and graduated from Springdale High School in 1980. He moved to Oklahoma where he spent the majority of his life with short stays in Dodge City, Kansas, and Lewiston, Idaho, but he eventually came back home to Oklahoma.

He started his 30-year plus career at 18 years old at Wal-Mart where he met and married the love of his life, Jerry Graham Booher. They married on April 30, 1982, and were married 36 years. They made their home in Bartlesville, Oklahoma. Of that union, four children and three grandchildren made their way into this world.

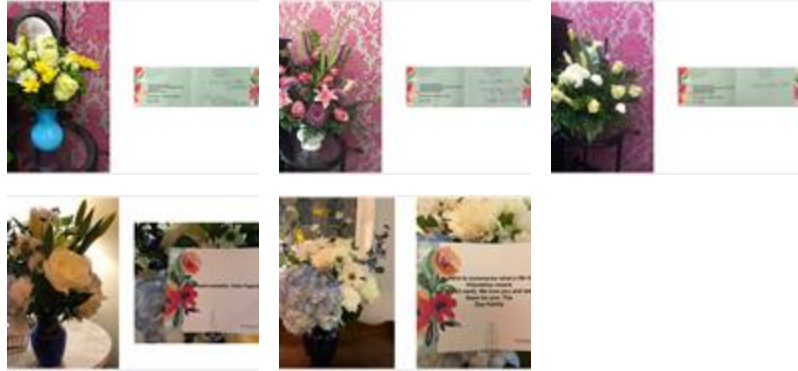

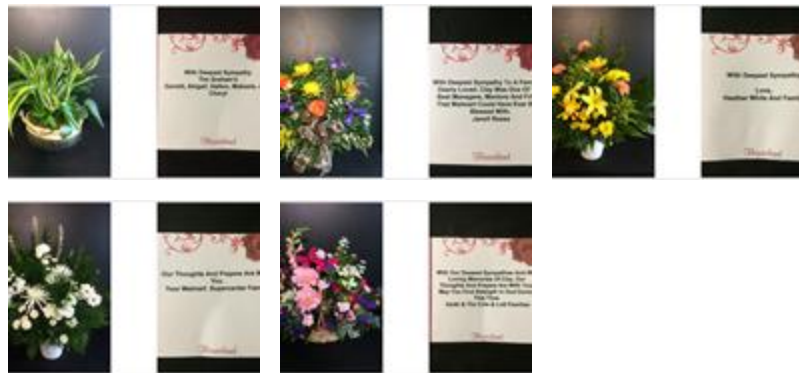
