“ I’m so sorry for your loss. I really didn’t know Cole personally, we had met under horrible circumstances.....but I have thanked God for him regularly since Nov. 30 2014.

Our kids (17 and 14) were hit head on between Bartlesville and Nowata...my husband and I were following them home. When Cole came to the scene, I honestly don’t remember too much until we were all loaded into the ambulance. He was the only paramedic and had both of my kids in the back. Cole was so patient and reassuring with our 14 y.o daughter as she was struggling to breathe and was very panicked. (She had a collapsed lung, broken back, massive concussion and various other injuries). He took such delicate and deliberate care of her.

Cole definitely saved our son’s life, as he realized while assessing him on route to Bartlesville’s hospital, that he needed emergency surgery for severe internal injuries. Mid route, Cole changed the plan and had Rico drive to St. Francis instead, he called ahead and told them to have the OR ready. Time was of the essence and his quick decision making, saved our son’s life.

We will always and forever consider Cole our angel. I wish his life wasn’t cut short, but he did some remarkable things saving others while he was here. I am so thankful for everything Cole did for our family that day. I’m so sorry for your loss and we will pray for Cole’s family, coworkers, and friends during this difficult time.
