Mr. Dale Allen Bishop, 64, of Tulsa and formerly of Bartlesville, died at 4:54 P.M. on Wednesday, November 18, 2015 at the St. John Medical Center in Tulsa.

Funeral services for Mr. Bishop will be held at 2 P.M. Monday, November 30, 2015 in the Butler-Stumpff Funeral Home Chapel, 2103 East Third Street in Tulsa with Chaplain Roger Sheppard officiating. Interment will be in the Fort Gibson National Cemetery at Fort Gibson, Oklahoma.

Mr. Bishop was born in Bartlesville on March 23, 1951 to Wilbur Richard Bishop and Mildred Mae (Mitchell) Bishop. He grew up and received his education in Bartlesville and graduated from Sooner High School in Bartlesville in 1969. While in high school he was active in the mixed chorus, concert choir, Interacts Club and played fullback on the Sooner Spartans football team. He entered the U.S. Air Force on September 18, 1969, served in Viet Nam and received his Honorable Discharge on July 31, 1973. He returned to Oklahoma where he owned Dale Bishop's Record Alley in the Brookside area in Tulsa. He was active in the Tulsa area for many years as a chef and had also been a chef in Hot Springs, Arkansas and Las Vegas, Nevada.

Survivors include his fiancée, Janet Parker of Tulsa, two children, Lindsey Bishop and Ian Bishop, one brother, Steve Bishop of Broken Arrow and one sister, Betty McCabe of Albuquerque, New Mexico. He was preceded in death by his parents.
