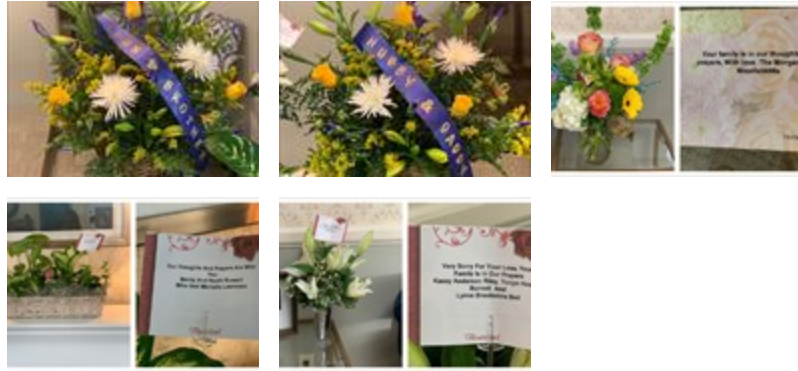

To Patty, Avah, Ella (Tiny) and the rest of the Hair family, David loved you guys so much and couldn't help but tell me all of the great things about you guys and all of the fun memories you all have spent together. He made me realize how important family is and even helped me in my own family life. I wouldn't trade the last 2 years at Trioiva for anything and cannot thank David enough for everything he did for me and the great memories we shared together.
