Debbie attended school at Dewey, OK, Caney Valley (Ramona), OK, and Rodgers State College. Excelling in athletics she played softball, basketball, and track events. Debbie married Steven Brewer on September 22, 1978, in Dewey, OK. After making their home for a short time in Dewey, they moved to the Ochelata, OK area and remained there until 2006. At that time, they moved to Matoaka Switch where they have made their home until now.

Debbie loved to lavish her attention on her children and grandchildren. She has volunteered with the Ochelata Athletic Association, Washington County Cherokee Association, and the Bible Holiness Church, Ochelata. Her work for the church resulted in her building all of the stained-glass windows for the church. She started with no training, worked to learn, then applied that knowledge to do all the windows herself. It was almost a three-year project.

Debbie was preceded in death by her father, her mother Shirly Hudgens, stepfather Les Hudgens, brother, Billy Jack Jenkins Jr., her grandparents, several aunts and uncles, and one nephew, Cody Thompson.
