Mr. Earl Van Cape, 81, longtime Bartlesville/Dewey area resident, died at 6:39 P.M. on Saturday, April 18, 2015 at the Jane Phillips Medical Center.

Mr. Cape was born at Dalton, Nebraska on February 26, 1934 the son of Robert and Mina (Mauer) Cape. He grew up and received his education at Dalton, Nebraska and graduated from high school there. He then served in the U.S. Army Intelligence Service in the late 1950's until receiving his Honorable Discharge. He returned to Nebraska where he was employed with Burlington Railroad as a railroad agent in Nebraska and then in Wyoming. In 1968 he was employed with Reda Pump in Thermopolis, Wyoming and where he was also active as a volunteer firefighter and served as chief of the volunteer fire department. In 1973 he transferred to Bartlesville with Reda Pump and he retired in 1988 as an industrial engineering technician.

Following his retirement he remained in the Bartlesville area where he returned to his roots and began raising cattle and horses. He was a member of the Antique Tractor Club, loved to fish and enjoyed having coffee with his friends. He was known among his friends and neighbors as the "fix it and go to guy" in the area.

Mr. Cape is survived by his three children, Dennis Cape and his wife T.J. of Forsyth, Montana, Lorena Holland and husband Lynn of Omaha, Nebraska and Shelly Kennedy and husband Ron of Mandeville, Louisiana, two brothers, Jerry Cape of Bradenton, Florida and Kayo Cape of Dalton, Nebraska, three

sisters, Connie Ankeny of Dalton, Nebraska, Sharon Cape of Estes Park, Colorado and Roberta Pierce of Bellevue, Washington, five grandchildren, Justin Cape, Sarah Holland, Rhiannon Holland, Thomas Kennedy and James Kennedy, numerous nieces and nephews and close family friends, the LaSpisa family of Bartlesville. He was preceded in death by his parents, four brothers, John, Charlie, Howard and Martin and two sisters, Gladys Runge and Jean Hall.

Funeral services for Mr. Cape will be held at 10 A.M. on Friday, April 24, 2015 at the Dewey United Methodist Church with Rev. Warren Peck officiating. Services are under the direction of the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory. Friends who wish may call for visitation at the Stumpff Funeral Home from 9 A.M. till 9 P.M. on Wednesday and Thursday as the casket will remain closed at the service.
