



## Emily Dawn Hood

March 9, 1976 - November 26, 2021

Emily Dawn Hood passed away on November 26, 2021, in Bartlesville, Oklahoma at the age of 45. Emily was born on March 9, 1976, in Bryan, Texas to David Thomas Moore and Junelle Beth (Minton) Moore.

Emily graduated from Ponca City High School in 1995, and then went on to pursue her Bachelors of Elementary at Oklahoma State University, and her Master of Counseling at Oklahoma Central University. She was a Licensed Professional Counselor at Children's Therapeutic Strategies, PLLC. In 1998, she married the love of her life, Danny Hood. Emily's biggest accomplishments were being the best wife, mother, daughter, and sister in the world. She enjoyed anything outdoors, being with friends and family, laughing and telling silly stories, making fun memories, decorating, crafts, collecting fun shoes and t-shirts, and watching television with the family. Some of her most important days were when she married her husband on May 16, 1998, the birth of her son, Nate, on September 12, 2003, and the birth of her second son, Luke, on September 29, 2006.

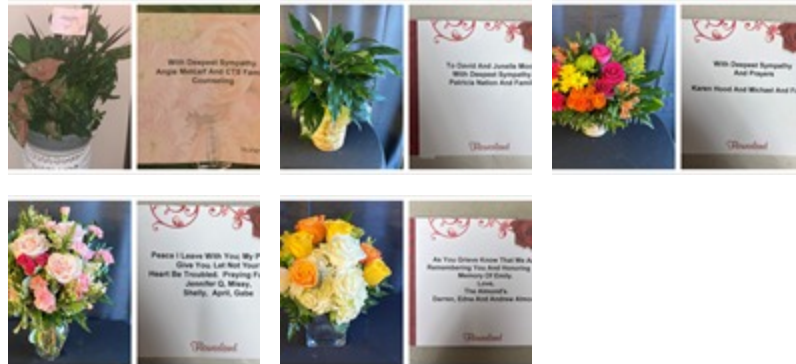
