Everett Winston Stewart Jr, 80, passed away December 26, 2018 in Bartlesville.

Everett was born on October 2, 1938 in Hutchinson, KS to parents Everett and Genieva (Nelson) Stewart. Everett married Vicki George on November 17, 1962 in Waynoka, OK. He received a Bachelor's Degree from Oklahoma State University in 1963 and a Masters Degree from Ft. Hays State College in 1965.

Everett worked several years as a guidance counselor in Marysville, KS. He then took a job in the Human Resources Department of Illinois Natural Gas Co. in Glen Ellyn, IL. Everett also worked in Human Resources for the W.R. Grace Company in Woodward, OK prior to moving to Bartlesville in 1980 to join the HR Department of Phillips Petroleum Company. In 1983, his career took another path when he started Equitable Financial Services, of which he retired from in 2005.

Everett was a big OSU sports fan and was a member of the OSU Sigma Chi Fraternity, of which he was very involved with their Alumni Association. Everett enjoyed the outdoors and was an avid golfer and hunter. He loved animals, especially his Labradors. He also enjoyed playing cards and was a Duplicate Bridge player. Everett was a very devoted family man and had a great love for

his children and grandchildren.
