(Floris) Irene Stewart was born in Maramec, OK, February 23, 1920, the only child to Albert and Alice Davis. She attended the University of Central Oklahoma, where she met her husband, Leslie Stewart, who became the principal of Lincoln Elementary in Bartlesville. Irene was the school librarian and 6th grade teacher at The former Garfield Elementary in Bartlesville. Later she taught at McKinley School. Irene loved to read and even at 98 could read a book a day. She volunteered at Jane Phillips Hospital, was a member of First United Methodist's 20th Century Class, and an active participant of the Home Demonstration Club. She lived for a time at Green Country, then moved to Overland Park, Kansas, to be near family. She was there five years before passing away June 29 after a stroke. She was a wonderful cook and was a home test kitchen for Betty Crocker. She was also an excellent seamstress. She leaves behind a son, David, a daughter, Marsha, three granddaughters (Amy, Laura, Emily), one grandson (Matthew), as well as six great grandchildren. 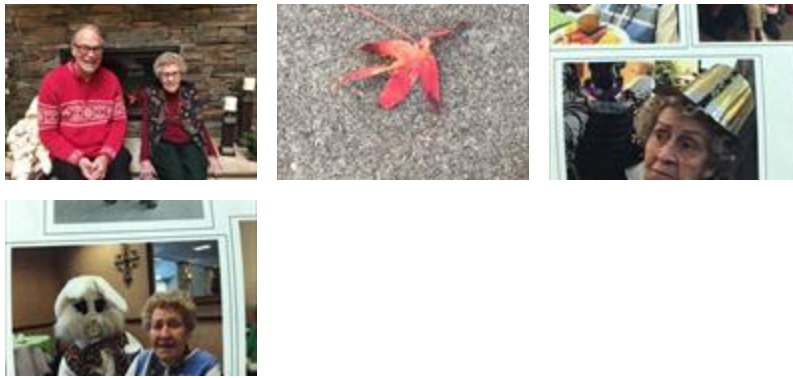
