Floyd M. "Bud" Inman, 80, formerly of Dewey, died at 5:50 A.M. on Friday in Caney, Kansas.

Services will be held at 2 P.M. on Tuesday in the Dewey Cemetery Pavilion, with Evangelist David Bycroft of the Tyro Christian Church officiating, and directed by the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory.

Mr. Inman was born July 19, 1934 at Lenapah, Oklahoma to Floyd Marvin and Gladys Marie (Tate) Inman Sr. He grew up and received his education at Lenapah Schools.
