Mr. Franklin Leon Sewell, 93, died at 10:55 P.M. on Monday, July 20, 2015 at the Jane Phillips Medical Center in Bartlesville.

Memorial services will be held at 1 P.M. on Saturday in the Stumpff Funeral Home Chapel in Bartlesville. Memorial services and cremation arrangements are under the direction of the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory.

Mr. Sewell was born at Independence, Kansas on April 25, 1922 the son of Gilbert Franklin Sewell and Marie Celia (Trumpower) Sewell. He grew up and received his education at Independence and was active in working on the family farm. He entered service with the United States Army Air Corps from October 1942, and served in the European Theatre. Following his Honorable Discharge in March of 1946 he returned to Coffeyville, Kansas where he worked as an auto mechanic at McCann Motors. He then began teaching auto mechanics and Southeastern Kansas VoTech School where he later became head of the auto mechanics department and taught advanced auto mechanics. He retired after 25 years of teaching and moved to the Grand Lake area to make his retirement home. He was married to Mildred Nadine Mills on October 15, 1944 at Fredonia, Kansas and she preceded him in death on August 7, 2006. He remained in the Grand Lake area until moving to Bartlesville in 2014. He loved to fish and work jigsaw puzzles.

Survivors include two daughters, Sheryl Duggan and Carla Boone both of Bartlesville, one brother, Donald Sewell of Fredonia, Kansas, six

grandchildren, Danny Duggan, Terry Duggan, Kim Young, Mendy Goad, Heath Potter and Adam Potter and three great grandchildren, Maddie Baty, Wyatt Baty and Aaron Young. He was preceded in death by his parents and his wife.
