Gerald Wade "Jerry" Loriaux, 64, resident of Bartlesville, died at 8:00 A.M. on Tuesday December 15, 2015 in Bartlesville.

Mr. Loriaux was born on March 31, 1951 at Herrington, Kansas to Francis Radolph and Lillian Nevora (Taylor) Loriaux. He moved to the Bartlesville area as a young boy in the mid 1950's and he was raised and educated here in Bartlesville school graduating for College High School with the Class of 1969. Soon after his graduation he entered the United State Army in 1970, and served in the Army during the Vietnam Conflict, until his Honorable discharge on December 11, 1972. He was active with his parents, Frances and Lillian Loriaux and his wife Pam in the operation of the Silverlake Farms south of Bartlesville, until he assumed the operation of the farm from his parents.
