Mrs. Ida "Mae" Gamble Lucas, 91, of Bartlesville and formerly of Hominy, died at 11:47 A.M. Saturday, March 26, 2011, at the Jane Phillips Medical Center in Bartlesville.

Funeral services for Mrs. Lucas will be held at 2 P.M. Tuesday, March 29, 2011, at the Hominy United Methodist Church with Rev. David Mingus officiating. Interment will be in the Albert J. Powell Memorial Cemetery at Hominy, directed by the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory.

Mae was born at Rowe, Oklahoma, on November 7, 1919, the daughter of William Solomon Tibbs and Ida Theora (Carnes) Tibbs. She began her education near Kansas, Oklahoma, and the Osage oil boom town of Denoya. She then attended Prairie View School in Seminole County where she was a passionate player on the girl's basketball team, played cornet in the band, and graduated from high school in 1938. She moved to Oklahoma City where she lived with her sister, Pearl, and met her future husband, Walt. On September 5, 1939, Mae married Walter Robert Gamble at Shawnee, Oklahoma, and they made their home in Oklahoma City. Pursuing his career in the oil business they also made their homes in Illinois and Corpus Christi, Texas. In 1952 they left Oklahoma City and came to Hominy, Oklahoma, to make their home when Walt opened the Baker Oil Tool Branch Office. Mae was active in Hominy community affairs including Epsilon Sigma Alpha (ESA) of which she was a charter member. She participated in March of Dimes, the Republican Party, a Cub Scout Den Mother and active in Boy Scout and Girl Scout activities. Additionally, she was a dedicated high school band parent and was instrumental in the fundraising effort for the city swimming pool. Mae was in the bowling league at Hominy where she was the first woman to roll a 200 game at the Hominy Holiday Lanes. Mae enjoyed playing games with her family. She was an avid pitch player who was still beating her family members till the end. An enthusiastic sports fan, she loved OU and OSU Men's and Women's Basketball, college and professional football. She had been an active member of the Hominy United Methodist Church, participated in the BOK Activities Center Bridge Group in Bartlesville, and as much as possible was active in attending her grandchildren's various activities. In later years, while living with Carol and her family, she lovingly kept close tabs on her grandsons, Jarod, Wes, and Evan.

Mae was employed as the bookkeeper at the Bill Fallin Ford dealership in

Hominy for many years until her retirement. Also, Mae and Walt worked together in their oil business. Walt preceded her in death on January 12, 1972. She later married Lloyd Lucas and they were active in quarter horse and thoroughbred horse racing in Raton, New Mexico, at La Mesa Park. She returned to her home in Hominy in 1987 and then moved to Bartlesville in January of 1997.

Survivors include two daughters, Judy Gamble of Tahlequah and Carol Martin and her husband Jimmy of Bartlesville, one son, Richard Gamble of Muskogee, seven grandchildren, Ann Marie Boatright Ryals, Neal Boatright, Terry Boyd Gamble, Christel Gamble Bouchard, Jarod Martin, Wes Martin and Evan Martin, eight great-grandchildren, her nieces and nephews to whom she was a special aunt, her special friend and caregiver, Joetta Hines of Copan, Oklahoma, and her son-in-law Jimmy's family. In addition to her husband she was preceded in death by her parents, two brothers, George Tibbs and Roy Tibbs, and four sisters, Effie Peyton, Pearl Cole, Mildred Evers and Alma June Tibbs.
