Mr. Jorg Gustav Pitts, 47, of Copan, died at 3:09 A.M. on Saturday, November 2, 2013 at the St. John Medical Center in Tulsa.

Mr. Pitts was born in Fairfax, Virginia on September 2, 1966 the son of Ellen Ruth (Oley) and George Gustav Pitts. He grew up and received his education in Roanoke, Virginia and graduated from high school there in 1984. He then attended Virginia Western Community College, served in the United States Marine Corps and following his Honorable Discharge attended aviation school

in South Carolina. At the age of 17 he received his private pilot's license at Casa Grande, Arizona and for a brief period was the youngest licensed pilot in the nation. He was employed with Hillman Aviation in Roanoke, Virginia and later made his home in Charlotte, North Carolina where he became active in the computer industry working for MEDFAX. In 2000 he moved to Copan and was married to Vickey Lynn (Call) Evans on November 25, 2000. They have made their home in the Copan area since that time and he owned and operated "Computer Works by Jorg" from 2000 till 2011. In 2011 he became employed as the Information Technology Specialist with the Copan Public Schools. He was a member of the Copan United Methodist Church, the Copan Community Action Team and was an assistant football coach at the Copan Public Schools for the past six years.
