He was raised and received his early education in Newkirk, Oklahoma until moving to Wichita, Kansas where he graduated High School in 1944. Mr. Hayes Entered the U.S. Navy on March 11, 1944 and was honorably discharged on July 22, 1946. He attended Kansas State University where he received degrees in Electrical Engineering and Business Administration in January 1951. In 1951 he moved to Bartlesville and began his career with Phillips Petroleum Company. He was

married to Donna Dee Reid on March 3, 1951 at Hutchinson, Kansas and they have made their home in Bartlesville since that time. Mr. Hayes was a charter member of the Oak Park United Methodist Church, the Bartlesville Masonic Lodge # 284 AF & AM., and the Order of the Eastern Star # 142.
