Marian Imogene Williams Richardson passed away Thurs, Sept 29, 2011. Funeral services will be held Tues, Oct. 4th at 10:00 AM at the Living Word Family Church in Nowata, OK directed by Stumpff Funeral Home. Interment will be 3:00 PM at Tahlequah City Cemetery.

Born in Buffalo, OK March 25, 1929 to Frank and Edith (Peck) Brown. Edith and children moved to OKC in 1936 where Marian met Jack Young and married him Feb. 23, 1947. From this union came four children. She worked at the University Medical Center from 1959 to 1966.

Marian married Oscar S. Williams May 11, 1966 and moved to Wagoner, OK. She substitute taught at Wagoner Jr. High School, volunteered at Wagoner Hospital Auxiliary for 20 yrs and was a member of OK Fashion Museum for 18 yrs. Her favorite hobbies included tending a large garden and canning. Marian and Oscar worked together on their retirement home on Hadley Mountain which was cut short when Oscar passed away in Nov. 1996 and Marian moved to Bartlesville the following year.

In Bartlesville Marian met Armel Edward Richardson at the 55+ Activity Center where she later served on the Board of Directors. They married one year later on December 18, 1998. After four months of marriage Armel passed away April 17, 1999. Since Armel's passing, Marian's life was happily shared with her best friend and companion John Jordon of South Coffeyville, OK.

Marian is survived by her three children; son Richard Young and wife Linda of Oklahoma City, daughter Nancy Tennant and husband Raymond of Nowata, son Daniel Young and wife Cindy of Anchorage, AK, her sister Legatha Garrison of Sulphur, 11 grandchildren and 9 great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents, first born infant child Brenda, Sister Frankie Drake and Brother Arthur Brown.
