Mary L Barnes died Thursday morning October 29, 2020 at the age of 77.

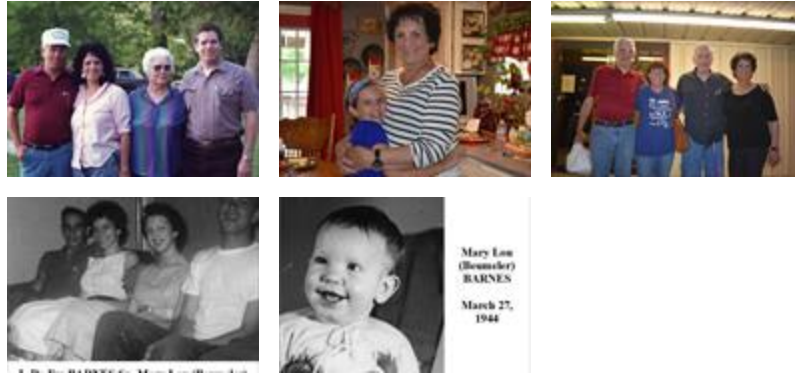
