Maxine Bottenberg was born October 25, 1921 in Parsons, KS. She passed away February 9, 2025 in Bartlesville, OK.

She was born and raised in Parsons, Kansas, where she graduated high school at age 16 and Parsons Business College at age 17, excelling in all business courses. Maxine moved to Bartlesville in 1941 to begin her career with Phillips Petroleum Company at age 19. She left Phillips in 1946 to get married and later raise her children. She returned to Phillips in 1962, and worked there until retirement in 1985 at age 64.

Maxine's favorite pastimes were spending time with her family, sewing, and quilting. After her retirement she was a member of three different quilt clubs and stitch groups. Her favorite quilts were those made with the Heartland Quilters for Veterans.

Maxine married Robert A. "Bob" Brown on April 26, 1946. They had three

children: Janet Barnett Langston, Jack L. Brown, and William R. "Rusty" Brown. Bob died in 1961. She was later married to Kenneth C. Bottenberg from March 16, 1963, until his death in October of 1997.

Maxine is survived by her daughter, Janet Barnett Langston, Ada, OK; her sons, Jack L. Brown (Sandy), Overland Park, KS, and William R. Brown (Susan), Olathe, KS; grandchildren, Craig Brown, Kelsey Cook, Andy Evola-Brown, Aaron Brown, and Katie Blake; and great-grandchildren, Clara Brown, Everett Brown, Margot Brown, Grayson Cook, Emma Cook, Orlando Evola-Brown, Archer Brown, Nolan Brown, Will Blake, Brady Blake, and Riley Blake.

She was preceded in death by Robert A. Brown, Kenneth C. Bottenberg, her parents Earl and Lois Primm, sister Betty Ruth LaDuke, brother Earl Russell Primm, and two grandchildren, Mark Barnett and Lance Barnett.
