Miles Ralph 'Windy' Long, 90, of Tulsa, OK passed away on June 10, 2019 in Owasso, Oklahoma. He was born January 25, 1929 in Wild Horse, Oklahoma to Miles and Dessie Jewel (Galyean) Long. Windy was raised and attended school in Wild Horse. He married Barbara Jean Thompson on Sept. 15, 1948 in Hominy, Oklahoma and had a son Mark Long. He attended Technical School and received Engineering Training. He worked at North American Rockwell, and for Boeing as an engineer. He was a member of The Assembly of God church at Wild Horse, where his oldest brother Melvin began his first Pastoring and where brother LeRoy used to sing special songs at times. In the 60's while living in Tulsa, he sang with the Tulsa Temple Gospel Quartet. "I loved my Lord Jesus for my good life and I will see you later (I Hope)".
