“ Today we will lay Nikki to rest. I was Nikki's sister-in-law. The law part never felt right as she always felt like my baby sister. She sometimes felt like our first child, before we had a child and Mike and I were also babies just doing our best. I met Nikki in 1993 when I first started dating her brother. We had picked her up at daycare because Loretta (their mom) had to work late and she bounced out of that place like a firework. She was a beautiful little curly headed spit fire and full of energy and things to say and questions to ask. It seemed her brothers goal in life was to see how quickly he could make her pee her pants by scaring her or tickling her. That never changed - EVER. It also seemed my goal in life was to keep all of that thick curly hair washed and brushed. Over the years, Nikki stayed with us a lot in the summers, at Christmas and Spring Break and lived with us several times throughout her life. We met Loretta and picked up Nikki at the Red River more times that I can count. Nikki loved Six Flags and roller coasters. She loved watching scary movies or anything scary that would keep her up all night long or make her pee her pants. She watched my Beaches movie on VHS at least 1000 times. She loved music and we always had the love of that movie (Beaches) in common and shared the songs from the soundtrack often. Our favorite was Glory of Love. She would eat everything in the pantry while we were at work and talk on the phone to her momma long distance (back when you had to pay for it) for what seemed like 12 hours a day. Nikki and Loretta were two peas in a pod and cut from the same cloth. After we lost Loretta, when she was sick she would call me often and have me forward her my voicemails from Loretta just so she could hear her mom's voice and try to find comfort in that. We always tried to be her soft place to fall but she often called on us to give her the hard truth, so we always did, good or bad. We certainly fought like sisters but loved like them too. I always wanted more in life for her than the choices she made but it was her life to live. She brought all of us great joy and love when she had Bailey and Olivia. In many ways those girls are just like her. One thing I know for certain is that we love them so much just like we always loved her. Nikki's absence in their lives will be felt by everyone around them. Her babies watched

her suffer for a long time and is likely a big part of their memories with her. I miss the calls telling us how they are acting just like her, doing the same things she did as a kid and the crazy things they say and do. My hope for Bailey and Olivia is that they dream big and worry little, take care of themselves first in life and while they are chasing their dreams they remember that we love them and so did their mom. Rest easy Nik! Your suffering is over– I love you!

“ I am Nikkis oldest brother Scott, it isn't easy knowing that my sister has passed and we have not spoken in the last 6 months since her and the girls moved out of our house. I was 16 when she was born and I actually drove my mom to the hospital in the snow to deliver her, our brother Mike and I named her, I chose Nicole so we could call her Nikki because Motley Crue was my favorite band and Nikki Sixx was the bassist, Mike chose Michelle after himself which I always thought was pretty cool. Things were a little rough back then and we all took care of her. Mom ended up moving her and Nikki to Colorado when I went to college and then she ended up in Texas where she stayed until she passed 5 years ago. Nikki never really got over moms passing. Nikki was home schooled for awhile then she came back to Oklahoma and stayed with our grandma Sue for a bit then ended up never going back to live in Texas and stayed here in Oklahoma. We fought, we laughed, we talked, we didn't talk, everything siblings do and she would go off and on not talking to me because I was the big brother and told her things she didn't want to hear sometimes lol. When she was here 6 months ago she was really sick, dialysis is extremely tough on a person, she lasted longer than most going through that, I truly believe it was simply that she did not want to leave the girls behind. She wasn't real big into going to church so when she was here I asked her if she had been saved after a Dr appt that was simply terrible news and she said no, so Tracy asked the Pastors to come to the house and save her and they did, that one thing alone gives me comfort in knowing Jesus was waiting for her as well as our grandparents, mom, uncle and numerous other friends and family in Heaven. Some believe in God, some don't, however I have witnessed too many things to ever deny Jesus, especially at the time of a recent family death. Nikki will definitely be missed, her girls, my nieces will be cared for and will get whatever help they need from my family, they are going to need it. Unfortunately a huge part of their lives she has battled severe diabetic issues and has been in and out of the hospital but they still had a lot of great time with their momma. Funerals/Death is not something I like to deal with, it really bothers me, I guess I am selfish and would love for everyone to have a

great extended life here but I know thats not the way it works. Do I want to go to this funeral? Absolutely not! This is definitely not one I want to go to, it will be hard, it has been hard and I don't like it. I have a lot of stories to tell, some good, some she would hate for me to tell even in death but for now this is all I can and am willing to share.
