After 32 years in rural Cherryvale, they moved to Bartlesville, Oklahoma. Louis passed away on April 26, 2016.

Norma is survived by her sons, Jeff Culp of Vail Arizona and Greg Culp (Kay) of Grove Oklahoma, her daughter Cheryl (Canaday) Gates of Owasso Oklahoma, 9 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren.
