Priscilla Jane Porter Snow was born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on November 11, 1949, and shortly thereafter was adopted by M. Lockwood and Ruth Jane Elliott Porter.

After making their home in Okmulgee, OK for 7 years, the family moved with Phillips Petroleum Company to the Woods Cross/Bountiful Utah area for 7 years. The family then moved to Bartlesville, Oklahoma.

Priscilla received her education in Utah and Oklahoma, graduating in 1968 with the first graduating class of Sooner High School in Bartlesville. She then went on to attend Central State University at Edmond.

In January 1971, she married the late Robert Wesley Snow of Dewey, making their home in Bartlesville, before moving to Memphis, Tn., Corpus Christi, Tx., and Russellville, Arkansas.

Her bookkeeping career started as a junior in high school with the LA McKinney Music Company and later with Oakley Pontiac Buick, Inc.

She would work as a bookkeeper in the car business both in Corpus Christi with Charles Thomas Courtesy Ford and in Russellville with Phil Wright Chevrolet.

When Priscilla returned to Bartlesville in 1980, she was again employed by Oakley Pontiac Buick, Inc where she remained until the dealership was sold in 2018. She then worked with Patriot Chevrolet until her retirement in 2020.

Priscilla's faith was important to her, and she attended Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church.

Her greatest enjoyment was her family. She enjoyed attending the many football and soccer games as well as many debate tournaments of her nieces, nephews, and great nephews. She even helped with a dog walking job of one of her great nephews, learning languages as they walked.

Besides her love for family was her love for her many beloved dogs, which were like her children.

Priscilla was preceded in death by her parents, and her brother, David W Porter of Skiatook, Oklahoma

She is survived by her nieces Christa Harris of Broken Arrow, OK, and Sarah Shepherd and husband Matt, and their children Colt and Mary, all of Ft. Worth, Texas; her nephew Max L.
