Ralph Lee Wilson, aged 76, passed away on July 19, 2024, in Skiatook, Oklahoma. Born on June 14, 1948, in Vinita, Oklahoma, Ralph dedicated much of his life to serving his country, family and community.

A proud veteran, Ralph served in the 199th Infantry Brigade of the United States Army as a sergeant during the Vietnam War. This serves as a testament to his bravery and commitment to his nation. He had many notable merits and honors including the Bronze star and the Combat Infantryman Badge. Following his military service, he embarked on a career in construction and bridge development.
