



Ramon Leon Brammer

May 21, 1927 - January 10, 2018

Mr. Ramon "Leon" Brammer, 90, of Bartlesville, died at 10:49 A.M. on Wednesday, January 10, 2018 at the Jane Phillips Medical Center. Memorial services for Mr. Brammer will be held at 10 A.M. Tuesday, January 16, 2018 at the East Cross United Methodist Church with Pastor Jeff Burress officiating. Cremation arrangements were under the direction of the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory.

Mr. Brammer was born in Enid, Oklahoma on May 21, 1927 the son of Otto and Mary Brammer. He grew up and received his education in Enid where he graduated from Enid High School and Enid Business College. He served with the United States Marine Corps in Japan from 1945 to 1946 and returned to Oklahoma following his Honorable Discharge. He was employed with Phillips Petroleum Company in Bartlesville in 1952 and remained in their employment as an accountant until his retirement in 1986. He was married to Sylvia Ann Schendel in Tulsa on September 4, 1954. They made their home in Bartlesville and were members of the Hillcrest Country Club for many years where they were both avid golfers. Mrs. Brammer preceded him in death on April 7, 2011. Mr. Brammer was a member of the East Cross United Methodist Church.

Mr. Brammer is survived by one son, David Brammer and wife, Annette of Cypress, Texas, three grandchildren, Justin Marshall, Lee Brammer and Ben Brammer and two great grandchildren, Hollis Brammer and Burke Marshall.

“*Mr. Brammer was such a nice man and one of my favorite people growing up across the street on Cornell. I have so many good memories which include him. One Christmas, IJ probably was eight or nine, I snuck downstairs on Christmas eve and hid behind chair in our living room. He and my father carried the presents in and after they left for more presents, which had been stored in the Brammer garage, I rushed back upstairs and flew under the covers!*

In the summer, when he'd wear short sleeves and mow his yard with push reel mower (maybe one of the reasons he was always son fit!) I'd ask about his tattoo and he would admonish me not to get a tattoo as "you can never get rid of them".

He was always willing to help anyone and so cheerful. My parents tell the story of him helping tow our dad's 1954 Ford to the mechanic. For whatever reason, my mother ended up driving the tow vehicle, while my dad from the 54 Ford and Mr. Brammer was in the passenger seat of the car with my dad. My mother went through an intersection where the cross traffic had the right of way and while she had plenty of time, the towed vehicle was in the path of oncoming traffic on Mr. Brammer's side and as the story goes, while they were not hit my dad thought Leon was going to crawl into his lap to get away from the oncoming vehicle!

So many other good memories and I know I'm a better person for having known Mr. Brammer. May he rest in Peace and his family be Blessed with the memories of a kind and generous life well lived.
