Rhonda M. Hayman, 53 of Barnsdall went home to her Heavenly Father on May 6th, 2024. Rhonda was born in Bartlesville, Oklahoma on January 10th, 1971, to Robert and Louise Juliano.

She attended kindergarten at Limestone School in Bartlesville. Then, she went to Osage Hills School from first grade through sixth grade. Rhonda attended Barnsdall School from 7th grade on and graduated in 1989. Soon after graduation, on July 15th, 1989, she married her high school sweetheart, Steve Hayman. The two have been inseparable ever since. They had two children. On January 1st, 1992, Steven "Kyle" Hayman was born, followed by Nathan Hayman on January 5th, 1995.

Rhonda's professional career began in high school when she worked at the United Grocery store. She went on to banking where she worked at Plaza Bank, only leaving because Aunt Kathy recruited her to work at Youth and Family Services.
