Robert Charles Davis, lovingly known as Charlie, passed away peacefully on July 17th, 2025, at the age of 63. Born on February 12, 1962, Charlie was a lifelong Oklahoma native and a beloved son, brother, father, grandfather, and friend.

Charlie began his career working for Phillips Petroleum and later became a dedicated route driver for Borden Milk and Coca-Cola. Eventually, he took the open road as a long-haul semi-truck driver, where he found freedom and independence and received many awards and acknowledgments for his driving skills. After many hardworking years, he retired at age 58. Charlie was best known for his striking blue eyes, his beautiful smile, and a heart that was open to everyone. He had a gentle, fun loving spirit, and never met a stranger. He enjoyed hanging out with friends and family, listening to great music, and was known as a fierce and talented foosball player in his day. As he got older, you could always find Charlie out playing shuffleboard, where he stayed competitive and social.
