



## Roberta "Robbi" Ann Cody

October 26, 1956 - August 18, 2018

Roberta (Robbi) Ann Cody, 61, went to be with Jesus on Saturday, August 18, 2018. She died at Jane Phillips Hospital following a fall during the night on Thursday; she never regained consciousness. We mourn the loss of our loved one, yet, we rejoice in her freedom from chronic pain, which she has suffered with for over 50 years.

Robbi was born October 26, 1954 in Borger, Texas. She lived in Bartlesville, OK, before moving to Overland Park, KS where she started second grade. She was a graduate of Shawnee Mission West High School and Kansas State University. After graduation, she remained in Manhattan, KS and worked a variety of jobs. In 1983, Robbi moved to Lincoln, Nebraska. She was employed by Metromail for 25 years before lay-offs ended her career. She moved to Bartlesville, December, 2008 and worked for Diversified Systems Resources (DSR) until her health caused her to leave and go on disability.

For Robbi, her faith was more important to her than her education or her jobs. At 15, Robbi became a Christ-follower. In 1983, Robbi moved as part of a team from her Manhattan church to plant a new church in Lincoln, Nebraska.

Her hobbies included reading and embroidery.
