Marie Blackburn Puckett of Bartlesville, OK died December 19, 2024 at age 96.

Marie was born May 12th, 1928, in Borger Texas to Nestor and Freida Coronis Gikas the youngest of six children. She graduated from Borger High School and went on to study Art and Architecture at Texas Tech in Lubbock.

Marie returned to Borger and met her future husband, Joseph Thomas (JT) Blackburn, Jr. while both were working for Phillips Petroleum Co.

They were married in January of 1952 at St. John's Catholic Church. While living in Borger, Marie and JT had five children. Marie helped design the new St. John's Catholic Church building and designed and sculpted the wood "Stations of the Cross" which remain in the church today.

In 1964, the family moved to Bartlesville Oklahoma. They were members of St. James Catholic Church. Marie taught art at St. James School and designed and sewed banners for the church. She continued her own art in acrylics, oil and terracotta sculpture. She made illustrations and silkscreened posters for local ballet performances. Marie was a longtime member of the Bartlesville Art Association (serving as president from 1969-1970) and participated in many local art exhibitions.

Marie loved concerts, theater and the ballet. She was a member of Nellie Johnstone Questers and the Tuesday Club. She also enjoyed socializing, gardening and flower arranging. Marie and JT participated in the Thirty Couples dance group.

Marie and Robert Andrew Puckett were married in August of 1999 at St. James Church. They had a special relationship having both lost their longtime partners.

Marie was preceded in death by husband J.T. Blackburn Jr. and husband Robert Andrew Puckett, son Paul Allan Blackburn and daughter Patty Sue Blackburn.

Survivors include: Daughters Kathryn Kindred and husband Jim, Marilyn Luther, Barbara Cooledge and husband Nathan, stepsons Bruce Puckett and wife Debbie, Bill Puckett and wife Dee, Jim Puckett and wife Darla, and numerous grandchildren and great grandchildren.
