Trenton began participating in Special Olympics at an early age and was still involved in recent years as a participant and as a mentor. In recent weeks he had been developing a plan to train his pastor's son to "bring home the gold".

Trenton was very active in his church, H.I.S. Life, of Nowata. The pastor and

church family were actual family to Trenton, and he loved them fiercely. They have all been instrumental in his growth and development and his passion to share the love of Jesus. Recently, Trenton had been helping lead worship at his church and leading a weekly bible study at the Hays House.

Trenton had many friends, young and old. He honestly loved each and every one in the most-sincere way. He was loving, loyal and literal. He had a unique and persistent method of inserting himself in the lives of those he loved and admired. In addition to all the friends he considered family, he also had a loving family at home.

Trenton's immediate family, his mom (Carrie), his brother (Tyler), sister-in-law (Jackie), his beloved niece, (Jayla) and his puppy, (Pete) were his home; his safe place; his comfort. He loved and idolized his brother (Bubba) from an early age. Tyler reciprocated with a quiet, tender, protective, love and watchful eye. Trenton adored Jayla and they were built-in best friends from the day she was born. Jackie was his daily "goto" especially when his mom said no. He spent many long days with Jackie, helping take care of puppies and making trips to the vet. He was always on the go and tried to stay as busy as possible, but without fail, if he was tired, sick, scared, or hungry, he wanted his mom.

Trenton's grandpa was special to him and taught him all about fishing at the age of 3 or 4. We have memories of him intentionally letting the air out of the boat trailer tires (at the age of 4) just so he could use his jack to jack it up. This unexpectedly slowed down grandpa's fishing trips on numerous occasions. We take great comfort in knowing that Trenton's final day was happy and filled with several of the things he loved: a nice home-cooked rib dinner, church worship and fellowship, followed by fishing with his friend, Cody.

Trenton has left his earthly home to go to his eternal home in the loving arms

of his Savior. We have no doubt that Trenton is coaching and cheering from above. We are comforted to know that we will meet him again and we are thankful for the lasting impression he has left in the hearts of so many.
