William "Bill" Hutton, of Nowata, OK, died Thursday October 12, 2017 at his home. He was 88.

Bill was born November 9, 1928 to Melvin and Gladys (Barnhill) Hutton in Nowata. He served the United States Army in Germany and Japan. After coming home from the service, he went to work at Reda Pump in Bartlesville for almost 40 years.
